WATCH OUT, HE'S BEHIND YOU...

Tommy Fleetwood looms over the early leaders at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship after a 66 at Carnoustie left last year's runner-up three off the pace set by Justin Walters of South Africa, with a pack of four one shot behind the leader

South Africa's Justin Walters shot an impressive 63 on a bright, blustery day on the Old Course to take a one-shot lead after the first round of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

England's Jordan Smith, New Zealand's Ryan Fox, France's Victor Perez and Spain's Adrian Otaegui are on 64, with a group of six other players a further shot behind.

However, they will all be looking over their shoulders at the menacing figure of Tommy Fleetwood,

one of the hot favourites. There was no disguising his intent as he shot an impressive six-under-par 66 at Carnoustie, the most difficult of the three courses.

Fleetwood, who has been runner-up twice in the Alfred Dunhill Links and was second in the Open Championship at Royal Portrush in July, said: "Carnoustie is clearly a course I feel pretty comfortable on. It's always good to get off to a good round here and a good start.

"I'd love to have this event on my C.V. I've always enjoyed it and played well. There's something

about playing at St. Andrews. I don't know what it is, but you walk in, and there's pictures of everybody who has won it and I've always thought I'd like to be one of them.

"There's a long way to go, but I've done all right in the past and hopefully on Sunday I have another chance."

Fleetwood now moves on to Kingsbarns, as does two-time winner Tyrrell Hatton, who also shot a 66 at Carnoustie and is trying to become the first man to win a record three Alfred Dunhill titles.

WALTERS: I FELT LIKE DAD WAS WITH ME

First round leader Justin Walters revealed the pain he has been suffering over the last few months after his stunning 63 at St Andrews.

The 38-year-old South African said: "I'd been swinging really well all year since the US Open, then I tore my hamstring. I finally got over that, and then I lost my dad.

"It was quite hard. I just decided not to feel sorry for myself and dust myself off and come here. It has a healing quality. I don't know, it's hard to describe.

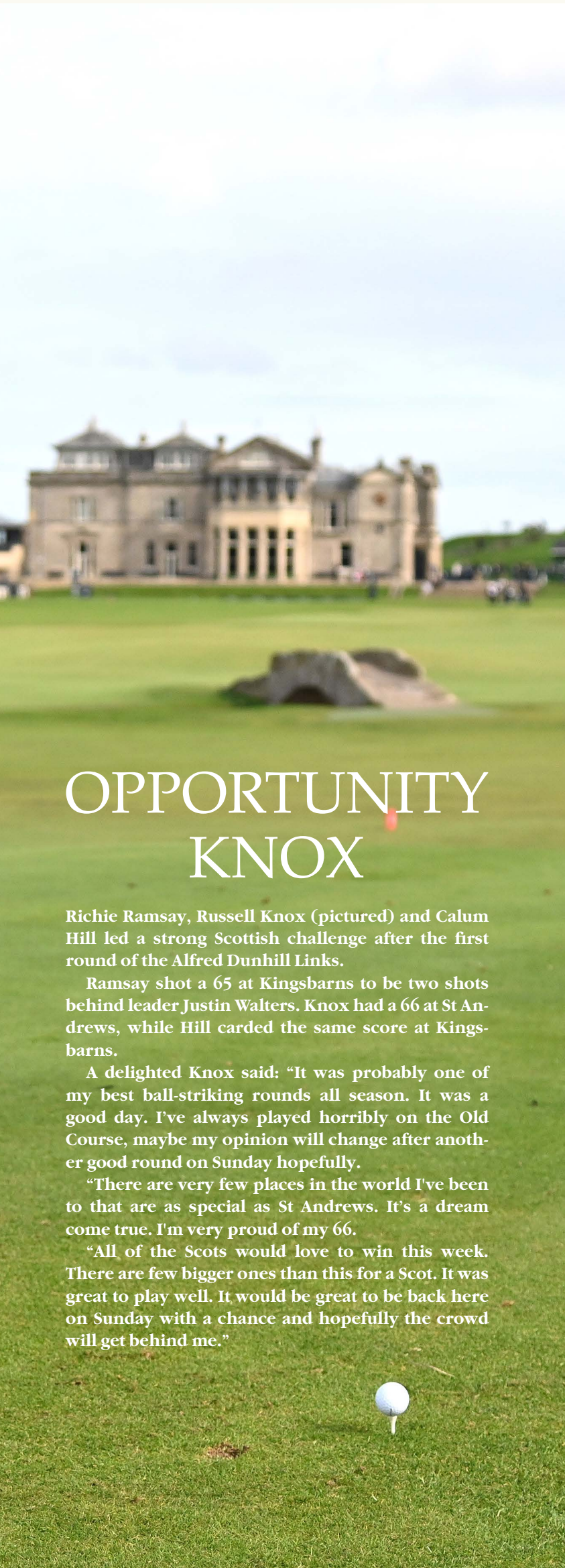
"I was here with my dad when we lost mum, and just thought I was back with him."

Walters said he felt he was in control of his game and able to make things happen. "I haven't shot anything under 69 or 68 in a long time. To do it here at St Andrews is special," he said.

The Alfred Dunhill Links Championship celebrates links golf at its finest and is played over the Old Course at St Andrews, the Championship Course at Carnoustie and Kingsbarns Golf Links. The final round, after the cut is made on Saturday, is played over the Old Course.

With a total prize fund of US\$5million, there are two separate competitions - an individual professional tournament and a Team Championship, in which each professional is paired with an amateur.





OPPORTUNITY KNOX

Ramsay shot a 65 at Kingsbarns to be two shots behind leader Justin Walters. Knox had a 66 at St Andrews, while Hill carded the same score at Kingsbarns.

A delighted Knox said: "It was probably one of my best ball-striking rounds all season. It was a good day. I've always played horribly on the Old Course, maybe my opinion will change after another good round on Sunday hopefully."

"There are very few places in the world I've been to that are as special as St Andrews. It's a dream come true. I'm very proud of my 66."

"All of the Scots would love to win this week. There are few bigger ones than this for a Scot. It was great to play well. It would be great to be back here on Sunday with a chance and hopefully the crowd will get behind me."

LOCAL CONNECTION HELPS PEREZ TO FAST START AT ST ANDREWS

Victor Perez has been living in Dundee while his girlfriend studies dentistry there, giving him a crash course in links golf that could be paying off for him this week

Frenchman Victor Perez shot a first-round 64 for a share of second at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship – then said it was all down to his local knowledge.

Perez posted an eight-under-par round across the Old Course and admitted he is no stranger to the famous links. "I live in Dundee. My girlfriend goes to dental school here, so I've lived here for the last year and a half."

"Being around here and playing links golf when I'm not playing tournaments definitely makes a big difference."

"I think a lot of the guys struggle with the greens being slow, but for me it's just a normal pace that I'm comfortable with. I don't think you can play enough links golf."

"I felt like the greens were receptive. There were a lot of scoring opportunities out there, and I took advantage."

Englishman Matthew Southgate, below, finished one shot behind Perez after shooting a 65 at St Andrews. "I've waited a long time to go down the last hole with that feeling," he said.

"In the last few years I've struggled at this event when it gets cold because I'm such a feel player, but we were blessed with the weather."

"I hit it exactly where I wanted to off the tee. I got the pace of the greens and made two really long ones. I didn't really hit a bad shot all day."

Meanwhile, world No 2 Rory McIlroy had a tougher time at Carnoustie, posting a two-under round of 70 across the famous Angus links.

"I played okay," he said. "I could have made a few more birdies, and then I made seven on the 6th hole, which was not ideal. It was nice to birdie the last, and my dad bettered me by five shots. It actually turned out to be a decent day."



BOYZONE STUFF AS RONAN SEES LEE HIT ANOTHER ACE

Lee Westwood made his 18th career hole-in-one yesterday and his celebrity partner has been alongside him for two of them

Lee Westwood celebrated a hole-in-one towards the end of his opening round at Carnoustie – the 18th ace of his career and, remarkably, not the first he has had when partnering singer Ronan Keating.

Westwood admitted he was frustrated with his game when he came to the eighth hole – his 17th after starting on the 10th – and a purely-struck 6-iron sent the ball straight into the hole on the 189-yard par three. The team of Westwood and Keating ended day one on five-under-par.

“The wind just dropped and I didn’t think I could get it there with a 7-iron,” said Westwood. “I had been hitting good iron shots but nothing was dropping for me with

the putter. That was one way of taking putting out of contention!”

The hole-in-one enabled Westwood to finish with a first round 69, three-under-par, and he added: “What was nice was that I saw the ball all the way into the hole. Sometimes, when you have a blind shot, or an uphill hole, you can’t see it when the ball drops, but this rolled across the green and just caught the right edge. That’s 18 holes-in-one overall, but I’ve had two playing with Ronan!”

It brought back memories of Westwood’s albatross in 2003, when he hit a 4-iron on the 9th hole at Kingsbarns on the way to claiming the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. It will not be easy for him to match that result, after finishing with a first round 69.



FOX IN THE HUNT WITH A LITTLE HELP FROM COMPETITOR WARNE

Kiwi golfer Ryan Fox believes that his friendship with Aussie Shane Warne helped inspire his first-round 64 and a share of second place at the Championship.

The pair also posted a 12-under par total in the Team Championship for a share of the lead and Fox credits the camaraderie he shares with cricket legend Warne as key to his low score at the Old Course.

He said: “It’s great having someone like Warney who really wants to be here and is really competitive. He’s disappointed when he stuffs up but is always delighted when he makes a birdie or scores for the team.

“It takes the pressure off my golf when I’m trying to play well for him, and that’s kind of what I’ve needed today.

“We get along really well and we’ve had a lot of fun out there in

the past couple of years. I’m a massive cricket fan and there were plenty of texts going back and forth during the Ashes.

“[Today] was just a really solid round of golf. I gave myself a lot of chances which I took advantage of on the back nine.”

Warne added: “To watch Foxy shoot 64 was unbelievable. He had five birdies on the back nine. I just stand back and applaud, the odd fist bump.”

Warne and Fox have come close to winning the Team Championship before. “We should have finished runners-up two years ago, only I missed a couple of little ones at the last and we ended third,” said Warne.

“Then last year we finished sixth or seventh. Our job as amateurs is to stay out of the way and admire, but also just to chat, which maybe helps relax these guys a little bit more.”





PETER THE DRAGON IS ALL BUSINESS ON COURSE

Dragons' Den investor Peter Jones reckons there is no better place than the golf course to strike business deals. Jones – currently eight-under-par in the Team Championship alongside Japanese pro Hideto Tanihari – believes that a few hours on the links makes for the best kind of business meeting.

"Golf is one of the most incredible social sports that combines everything," he said. "I've talked about many transactions on the golf course – and it still didn't put my game off."

"Where else would you get four-to-five hours to spend with somebody? Normally you are in meetings which are short and sweet and you move on."

"The golf course is a relaxed environment and you get to know the person you are dealing with."

"I do get a lot of [golf-related] pitches, but there are so many amazing products already. It's very difficult because I'm probably not good enough to decide what would and wouldn't sell."

Jones, a member at Quinta Do Lago in the Algarve, is now a regular at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship and admits he clears his diary every year in the hope of getting invited back.

"There's no chance I will allow anyone to put anything in my diary for this week. In fact, I'll block it out for the next 20 years."

NO MORE GIGS BUT GOLF'S THE BEST THERAPY FOR HUEY

The singer has been unable to play concerts for two years due to a disease that affects his hearing intermittently, but playing golf has helped him to stay positive

Huey Lewis hits the golf course for therapy as well as fun these days, after he was diagnosed with a disease which causes partial deafness. The rocker has not gigged in two years after discovering he has an inner-ear disorder called Meniere's disease.

Lewis, who is four-under-par in the Team Championship after his first round at St Andrews with pro partner and fellow American Julian Suri, explained how the disease has impacted on his life. "Meniere's disease is episodic, it fluctuates. Right now I'm pretty good, but if it goes bad I can't hear music. I haven't been able to work in two years because I can't hear music consistently enough. I

might have one day when I'm okay, but there might be weeks when I'm just about deaf."

Lewis says he has found solace on the golf course. "Rather than worry, golf is something to do."

At least you're worrying about your golf ball and not your hearing.

"I've learned not to be too intensive as I'm getting older. The important part is to remember to have a good time."

REDKNAPP TAKES TO HICKORY CHALLENGE

Football pundit Jamie Redknapp was one of a group of Alfred Dunhill Links amateurs to sample a bit of Old Course history by taking on the Home of Golf with hickory clubs.

Redknapp was joined by Shane Warne, Kevin Pietersen, Michael Vaughan and Vinnie Jones as he tried out clubs including the jigger, niblick and spoon down the 18th hole at St Andrews.

Redknapp, playing with pro partner Luke Donald, had his usual bag back as they finished their first round at Carnoustie on 6-under in the Team Championship.

A broken wrist prevented him playing in 2018, and he feared the worst. "You worry that you won't get invited back!" he said.

"It's the one week where you get as close as you're ever going to get to being a professional."

MIN WOO HEADS BACK TO SCHOOL

Australian professional Min Woo Lee was the latest golfer to answer questions from kids at Kingsbarns Primary School

Pupils at Kingsbarns Primary School were visited by Min Woo Lee, a first-year pro from Perth, Western Australia this week and, as usual for this annual event, the visiting golfer faced an interesting range of questions.



Min Woo turned professional in February this year and is the younger brother of Minjee Lee, the former World No 1 female golfer.

His inquisitors were between the ages of 5 and 11 and their questions included: “what’s the best thing about playing golf?” (travelling all over the world); “do you use technology to learn golf?” (yes, using wires to assess our swing) and “have you ever seen a snake on a golf course?” (no!).

Playing in his first Alfred Dunhill Links Championship, Min Woo opened with a two-under-par 70 at St Andrews yesterday, playing with his partner, Jacques Kallis, the South African cricket great.

This is the 11th year that the organisers of the Alfred Dunhill Links have arranged a visit to the school by one of the competitors.



HOGAN’S ALLEY WINS OUT IN PADRAIG’S PICK

Padraig Harrington has revealed his pick of the 54 holes across the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship – and it’s the 6th at Carnoustie: Hogan’s Alley.

Harrington, winner of this event in 2002 and 2006, chose his top six Championship holes and had this to say about his favourite: “Not only is it difficult, it’s the best-designed hole we will ever see. It’s as much a mental test as it is a physical one.”

Hogan’s Alley, pictured below, takes its name from the audacious line taken by Ben Hogan on his way to victory at the 1953 Open Championship. Playing in his only Open, the American split the out-of-bounds fence on the left and

the treacherous fairway bunkers on the right to open up an attack on the green at what was then a 565-yard par-5.

Harrington chose the 18th at Carnoustie in second place. “It’s the toughest finishing hole in tournament golf,” he said of the site of his playoff victory over Sergio Garcia in the 2007 Open.

In third, the Ryder Cup captain went for the 12th at the Old Course: “It’s a fantastically designed golf hole. It gives birdies, you can make bogeys on it, it gives you problems and I like that in a golf hole.”

The 11th at the Old Course was fourth on Harrington’s list, followed by the final hole at Kingsbarns and the 6th hole at the same course.



SHEVCHENKO ON THE SPOT AT UNI EVENT

Ukrainian football ace Andrii Shevchenko and businessman Mark Madden spoke to students at the University of Dundee before teeing off in the Alfred Dunhill Links.

The pair, who are collaborating on sports lead initiatives, visited the university’s Centre for Entrepreneurship, where they spoke to students, staff and entrepreneurs. The event was hosted in conjunction with Elevator, Scotland’s leading business support organisation.

Shevchenko won the Ballon d’Or for the world’s best footballer in 2004. He is now head coach of Ukraine’s national squad.

Playing off an impressive one handicap, with his pro partner Nicolai Højgaard, he was 10-under in the Team Championship after his first round at St Andrews.

Following a successful career in the investment banking and hedge fund industry, Madden now runs his own boutique family office, Peregrine390.

He was second in the 2015 Team Championship and, playing with Norwegian pro Kristoffer Reitan, finished yesterday on 12-under and they lead the field.



The St Andrews night sky will come alive with a spectacular fireworks display on the eve of the final day of this year’s Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. An annual favourite with golfers, spectators and St Andrews residents, the display will begin at 8.25pm on Saturday and take place on the West Sands, adjacent to the Old Course. The best view will be from Links Road, behind the 17th green on the Old Course, and from the track in front of the Old Course Hotel.

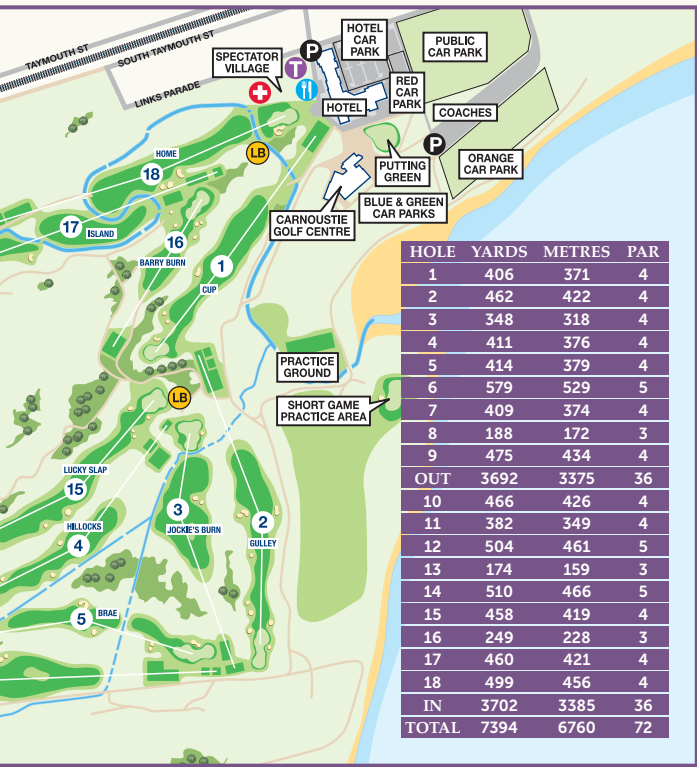
